# Evangelism

## Made Easy - As Simple as 1,2,3!



The current crisis will be with us for a while, and though presenting plenty of challenges – it does create some unique opportunities.

Many people have a Netflix subscription, which fills their inboxes with the latest picks for them to watch. But how many re-runs can a person bare!

There is that new series everyone raves about (over social media) – ok that covers another 10-12 hours - what then? Why not invite them to watch something more substantial. Church online does have its issues, and we should not ignore them. We should meet, and personally I am looking forward to meeting together once again as a church family in the flesh. But the current circumstances have created evangelism opportunities, which make it easy to

invite others to hear the gospel. Here are some things we could be doing to evangelise our neighbours.

1. Pray - Prayer is always the first step in evangelism. God creates Christians. Paul teaches in 2 Corinthians that we are a new creation. The implication of being a new creation in Christ is that the only person capable of creating is God, therefore we ask God to work in people to trust Jesus. Paul often calls on Christians to call for opportunities to preach the gospel, and though we are now doing church through the internet, we need to praying that God will bring people to know Him through His Son.
2. Ask people what they are watching. Everyone is now at home in

quarantine, even with work they are most likely going to be watching more T.V. Not everyone can livestream, though most people these days have the ability to watch streamed material, even if they don't know it. So ask them what they are watching. This will not be an invasive question now as most people don't have much to do with their free time. As you talk to people about what they are watching, it is a great opportunity to suggest the Barney's livestream.

3. Invite people out for a virtual coffee. For the more adventerous, have a coffee over the internet, there are plenty of free tools allowing us to meet online. The longer this quarantine continues, the more people will long for personal contact. When talking to people have something with the Barney's web address to easily share available.
